

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
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## July Staff Pick

#### **GOLF CARTS ON CITY STREETS**

- **4.15** Golf Cart Operation on City Streets. It shall be unlawful to operate a Golf Cart upon a public right-of-way unless the following requirements are met:
- A. The Golf Cart is operated on a public street or alley between sunrise and sunset, and
- B. The Golf Cart is equipped with a slow moving vehicle sign and a bicycle safety flag, and
- C. The Golf Cart is equipped with adequate brakes.



Thank you for participating in this survey; the data collected will allow us to provide accurate sampling and test results to determine the level of lead and copper found in our homes and businesses and to make appropriate treatment changes to lower or eliminate lead or copper leaching from service lines, plumbing, and fixtures in our customers' homes and businesses.

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Radon is an odorless, colorless, radioactive gas that is produced from the decay of naturally occurring uranium in the soil. Indoor levels can be very high. It doesn't matter where you live, how old your home is, or what type of foundation it has.

The only way to know the level of Radon gas in your home is to perform a test.

Radon enters buildings through cracks in the floors or walls; usually, the highest concentrations are in the basement or crawlspace. Most exposure to Radon comes from being indoors. Licensed daycares and schools are required to test and mitigate by law, but we have no current regulations for our homes.

Hopefully, we will have an lowa policy in the future – to test for Radon prior to the transfer of ownership so that new owners are aware of the health risks for their families and can mitigate them.

- 7 of 10 homes in lowa have an unacceptable level of Radon.
- The average indoor radon concentration in lowa is more than six times the national average.

By breathing in radon gas, it gets trapped in our lungs and damages the lung tissue. Exposure to Radon gas causes lung cancer, in fact, it is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the U.S. (second only to smoking).

Radon testing is very easy and inexpensive. Kits are available to pickup at the Pottawattamie County Public Health Clinic or Planning Department office at a cost of \$12.50.

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# YELLOW LEVEL WATER MANDATORY WATER RESTRICTIONS Please remember that the recent rainfall is not filling the aquifers that supply the water towers.

Top soil or sub-soil may have benefited from past rainfall, but Regional Water has not removed their restrictions.

- A. Outdoor watering or irrigation of lawns is prohibited.
- B. Outdoor watering of any kind is prohibited between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. daily.
- C. <u>Water or irrigation of flower and vegetable gardens, trees and shrubs less</u>
  <u>than 4 years old, and new seeding or sod is permitted once per week with an application not to exceed one inch.</u>
- D. Car washing is prohibited except in commercial establishments that provide that service.

  In these cases, hours of use will be restricted to 8:00 am to 8:00 PM.
- E. No water shall be used to fill private/residential swimming pools, children's wading pools, reflecting pools, or any other outdoor pool or pond.
- F. No water shall be used to wash streets, parking lots, driveways, sidewalks, or building exteriors.
- G. Large volume water users, including industries, motels, hotels, and eating establishments may be requested to scale back services.
- H. Schools will be required to cancel their physical education activities and inter-scholastic competitions that require showers or attract crowds and take other actions to reduce water consumption at sport complex.
- I. Water shall be served at restaurants only upon the request of the customer.
