BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR Chapter 4: Offenses Subject to a Municipal Infraction Penalty

4.1 Municipal Infraction Penalty.

A violation of this Chapter or the omission or failure to perform any act or duty required by the same, is a municipal infraction punishable by civil penalty not to exceed seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00) for the first offence and not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for each repeat offense. Each day that a violation occurs or is permitted to exist constitutes a repeat offense.

4.19 Placing Debris on Street or Sidewalk.

It shall be <u>unlawful for any person to throw or deposit on any street or sidewalk</u> any yard waste, glass, glass bottle, nails, tacks, wire, cans, trash, garbage, rubbish, litter, offal, or any other debris, or any other substance likely to injure any person, animal, or vehicle.

<u>R & S Waste WILL pick up your Recycables from their</u> <u>Recycyling Bins ONLY IF the following rules are followed:</u>

Food & beverage jars and bottles only

- Empty and RINSE jars and bottles
- Throw away the lids
- Labels are okay

Aluminum foil containers, tin food & beverage cans

- Empty and RINSE cans.
- Labels are okay.
- Place lid inside rinsed can.

Clear & colored plastic containers 1&2symbol.

- Empty and rinse all jugs and bottles.
- Throw away all lids.
- Most symbols are on the bottom of the bottle.

Newspapers (including all inserts), phone books, magazines, catalogs, office paper and box board containers (cereal boxes, gift boxes, shoe boxes).

- Remove all plastic liners from box board containers and <u>flatten the boxes</u>.
- Do not place paper products loose in your recycling bin or mix with your glass, cans or plastic containers.
- <u>SET OUT ONLY ON DRY DAYS</u> If it is raining, please hold paper items until next recycling day.










6.8 RIGHT OF WAY REGULATIONS

The purpose of this section is to ensure that all public grounds, utility easements, streets, sidewalks, alleys, bridges, culverts, overpasses, underpasses, grade crossing separations and approaches, public ways, squares, and commons are open, in repair, and free from nuisance.

C. Maintenance of Area Between Lot Line and Curb Line.

It shall be the <u>responsibility of the abutting property</u> <u>owner to maintain all property outside the lot and</u> <u>property lines and inside the curb lines or edge of</u> <u>public streets</u>, except that the abutting property owner shall not be required to remove diseased trees or dead wood on the publicly owned property or right-of-way. <u>Maintenance includes timely mowing, trimming trees</u> and shrubs and picking up litter.



I. Responsibility for Maintenance of Driveways and Sidewalks.

<u>It is the responsibility of the property owners</u> abutting any public right-of-way to repair, replace or reconstruct, or cause to be repaired, replaced, or reconstructed, all broken or defective drive-ways and sidewalks and <u>to maintain it in a safe and hazard-free condition</u>.

K. Responsibility for Sidewalk Maintenance and Liability for Injuries.

It is the responsibility of the abutting property owners to repair, replace or reconstruct, or cause to be repaired, replaced or reconstructed, all broken or defective sidewalks and to maintain in a safe and hazard-free condition any sidewalk outside the lot and property lines and inside the curb lines or traveled portion of the public street. An abutting property owner who fails to maintain or repair defective or broken sidewalks as set forth in this section shall be liable for damages caused by said failure to repair, replace or reconstruct broken or defective sidewalks. The City's general duty to maintain public places pursuant to Section 364.12 of the Code of Iowa does not include a duty to remove natural accumulations of snow or ice from sidewalks or to repair, replace or reconstruct all broken or defective sidewalks. However, when the City is the abutting property owner, it has the specific duty of the abutting property owner as set forth in this section.

GOLF CARTS ON CITY OF AVOCA STREETS

4.15 Golf Cart Operation on City Streets. It shall be unlawful to operate a Golf Cart

upon a public right-of-way unless the following requirements are met:

- A. The Golf Cart is operated on a public street or alley between <u>sunrise and sunset</u>, and
- <u>B.</u> The Golf Cart is equipped with a slow moving vehicle sign and a bicycle safety flag, and
- C. The Golf Cart is equipped with adequate brakes.

ADDITIONALY ALL DRIVERS MUST MEET THE STATE OF IOWA CODE:

Under Code Section 321.174

It is unlawful for anyone to operate a "motor vehicle", including a golf cart, upon

streets and high-ways unless the operator has a valid driver's license.

Under Section 321.20B

Golf carts cannot be operated on high-ways or city streets unless financial liability

coverage (insurance) is in effect for the vehicle and the driver has proof of insurance

in his/her possession.



YELLOW LEVEL WATER MANDATORY WATER RESTRICTIONS Please remember that the recent rainfall is not filling the aquifers that supply the water towers.

<u>Top soil or sub-soil may have benefited from past rainfall, but</u> <u>Regional Water has not removed their restrictions.</u>

- A. Outdoor watering or irrigation of lawns is prohibited.
- B. Outdoor watering of any kind is prohibited between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. daily.
- C. <u>Water or irrigation of flower and vegetable gardens, trees and shrubs less</u> <u>than 4 years old, and new seeding or sod is permitted once per week with an</u> <u>application not to exceed one inch.</u>
- D. Car washing is prohibited except in commercial establishments that provide that service. In these cases, hours of use will be restricted to 8:00 am to 8:00 PM.
- E. No water shall be used to fill private/residential swimming pools, children's wading pools, reflecting pools, or any other outdoor pool or pond.
- F. No water shall be used to wash streets, parking lots, driveways, sidewalks, or building exteriors.
- G. Large volume water users, including industries, motels, hotels, and eating establishments may be requested to scale back services.
- H. Schools will be required to cancel their physical education activities and inter-scholastic competitions that require showers or attract crowds and take other actions to reduce water consumption at sport complex.
- I. Water shall be served at restaurants only upon the request of the customer.
