

Call me a scrooge, but I was never really a fan of A Christmas Carol, by Charles Dickens. I have, however, learned to appreciate it since reading Mr. Dickens and His Carol, by Samantha Silva. This historical fiction tale takes us back to Dickens's day and draws us into his world, where we meet his family and the daily pressures of his life as he is forced to write a Christmas novella. Silva has woven fiction with facts that pulled me through the story to the end, entertaining me all along the way. I highly recommend this

story if you want a unique Christmas read for this season.

(And if you've never read the original, you can also find copies of Dickens's novella A Christmas Carol here at the library.)

Did you know... Dickens wrote A Christmas Carol in just six weeks, under financial pressure. Reportedly Dickens wrote the story while taking hours-long nighttime walks around London.

Did you know... A Christmas Carol was first published on December 19, 1843, with the first edition sold out by Christmas Eve. By 1844, the novella had gone through 13 printings and continues to be a robust seller more than 175 years later.


Stop in at the Avoca Public Library this month to see the parade of trees, including the Avoca Memory Tree, all of which will be up through the new year!

YELLOW LEVEL WATER MANDATORY WATER RESTRICTIONS Please remember that the recent rainfall is not filling the aquifers that supply the water towers.

Top soil or sub-soil may have benefited from past rainfall, but Regional Water has not removed their restrictions.

- A. Outdoor watering or irrigation of lawns is prohibited.
- B. Outdoor watering of any kind is prohibited between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. daily.
- C. <u>Water or irrigation of flower and vegetable gardens, trees and shrubs less</u>
 <u>than 4 years old, and new seeding or sod is permitted once per week with an application not to exceed one inch.</u>
- D. Car washing is prohibited except in commercial establishments that provide that service.

 In these cases, hours of use will be restricted to 8:00 am to 8:00 PM.
- E. No water shall be used to fill private/residential swimming pools, children's wading pools, reflecting pools, or any other outdoor pool or pond.
- F. No water shall be used to wash streets, parking lots, driveways, sidewalks, or building exteriors.
- G. Large volume water users, including industries, motels, hotels, and eating establishments may be requested to scale back services.
- H. Schools will be required to cancel their physical education activities and inter-scholastic competitions that require showers or attract crowds and take other actions to reduce water consumption at sport complex.
- I. Water shall be served at restaurants only upon the request of the customer.
